# 2011 Highlights

Happy New Year wishes from the Albanian American Medical Society. The beginning of the 2011 calendar year for AAMS was marked with an exciting trip to Macedonia and shortly after with the first AAMS Gala event. On March 3-4, 2011, local Albanian physicians in Macedonia and the Minister of Health, Dr. Bujar Osmani, greeted President of AAMS, Dr. Lindita Çoku and society member, Physician Assistant Sihana Sela. The successful trip fulfilled many of the society's objectives including fostering a network of physicians in the Albanian community abroad, educational lectures for the medical staff and students, and providing the Albanian medical community in Macedonia with a link to American observerships and other opportunities.

Upon return from the Macedonia trip, AAMS hosted the first Gala event on March 19, 2011 at the Harvard Club, New York City. After welcoming remarks from President Dr. Lindita Çoku and Co-Chairman Dr. Sulejman Çelaj, Honorary Chairman and 1998 Nobel Laureate in Medicine & Physiology, Dr. Ferid Murad, presented Dr. Agim Leka with the Lifetime Achievement Award. The honored guests were Dr. Peter W. Carmel, the President of the American Medical Association, and Dr. Jaime R. Torres, New York Regional Director of US Department of Health and Human Services. The celebration of the Albanian American medical community at the gala was concluded with traditional music and dancing.

# AAMS 3<sup>rd</sup> Anniversary

The Albanian American Medical Society celebrated its 3<sup>rd</sup> Anniversary on July 23, 2011 at Giovanni's restaurant in Bronx, NY. Moderator for the event, Physician Assistant Sihana Sela, invited Dr. Selahedin Velaj, PhD to raise the society's flag for the first time. Dr. Velaj, a 90-year-old Albanian American from Vlora, was presented with the Senior Membership Certificate on behalf of his son, Dr. Richard Velaj (Drini), a Harvard trained neuroradiologist, who lost his life in a tragic accident on October 14, 2010.

Honored guests at this event were Dr. Edward H. Oruçi, first generation Albanian-American and interventional cardiologist at St. Francis Hospital, Roslyn, New York; and Dr. Lydra Tapija, an Albanian-American dentist, leading her private practice in Bronx, New York.

Welcoming remarks were offered by Dr. Lindita Çoku, stating "success for our members is also a success for our country". Dr. Çoku referenced an article, "Serious Reportable Events: transparency, accountability critical to reducing medical errors and harm". The emphasis was placed on the cost of medical mistakes and the need of accountability by those responsible, including physicians, nurses, pharmacists, etc.

Three additional new members of the society were presented with membership Certificates: Matilda Haxhari, dental clinic office manager in New York, graduate with Bachelor's Degree in Biology from St. John's University, and aspirations of becoming a dentist; Kledia Myrtolli, graduate from Yale University with Bachelor Intensive Degree in biology, currently second year medical student pursuing an MD at New York Medical College; and Ershela Durresi, graduate of Yale University with Masters in biology and currently a second year medical student pursuing an MD/PhD at Harvard School of Medicine.

Dr. Sulejman Çelaj, MD, co-chairman of the society, reviewed the historical milestones of AAMS. He also described the events organized and initiated by AAMS including donations presented by Dr. Ismet Lukolic at the Prishtina University Medical Center; "Dinner with a Doctor" at St. Barnabas Hospital for the Albanian Community led by Dr. Çelaj; an Albanian Health Fair held in Hartsdale, NY at Our Lady of Shkodra Church; and continuous pro-bono work the society offers to Albanian immigrant patients. Dr. Çelaj also reviewed plans for future programs including the Illyrian Heart Program in the Albanian territories of the Balkan Peninsula providing prevention, intervention, and intensive care of cardiac illnesses.

Dr. Bashkim Kadriu, presented his research project, completed at the College of Medicine at Chicago, titled "Anticonvulsant and neuroprotective properties of imidazo-benzodiazepine drugs against status epilepticus and neuronal damage". Dr. Kadriu studied at the University of Prishtina and has currently joined Albert Einstein's University of Yeshiva in Bronx, NY.

Celebration and festivities continued with networking amongst the members.

# **Annual Report from AAMS External Communication Coordinator**

Irida Hasalla, MD, Chief Medical Resident at St. Barnabas Hospital in NY, manages the electronic correspondence for AAMS (e-mail address: <a href="mailto:info@albamedsociety.org">info@albamedsociety.org</a>) from 7/01/2011 to present. During this period of time, AAMS has received numerous e-mails. The vast majority of them are sent from students from Albania, Kosova, and Macedonia that have finished medical school and want to get more information about entering residency programs in the United States. Each email receives correspondence about the exams that they have to take and the importance of the scores on these exams as a key to open doors for future residency applications.

Another group of e-mails has been sent from individuals asking for assistance, financial or medical, to whom, with the help of AAMS president we have replied accordingly within our limited possibilities as a newly formed society with modest funds, but with a great arsenal of Albanian medical personnel assistance. To mention one of them, the case of an Albanian patient suffering from glaucoma that we referred to Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary, and to go the extra mile, Dr. Çoku also supplied him with special glaucoma glasses.

The society also received e-mails regarding employment opportunities from US clinics wanting to hire Albanian speaking physicians and from American physicians interested in working in Albanian inhabited territories. These requests were made available to all AAMS members in the hope that someone might be interested.

To mention last, but not least, are the numerous e-mails that are received from individuals who appreciate the existence of our medical society here in the United States. They have also expressed their desire to be part of the society and AAMS has welcomed them with open arms.

#### Albanian Health Fair

On Saturday, October 15, 2011, the Healthy Bronx Initiative partnered with the Albanian American Medical Society to host a successful and informative community health event for Albanians at the Bronx House.

The event, co-sponsored by St. Barnabas Hospital and Committee of Interns and Residents, featured five medical professionals presenting in Albanian and English, the symptoms, preventative measures, and treatment options for diseases prevalent within the community including, diabetes, asthma, hypertension, depression, and cancer. Each presentation was followed by a "question and answer" session. The participants that attended also had the opportunity to collect information and speak individually with the doctors between presentations.

Speakers included: Dr. Merita Shehu; Sihana Sela, Physician Assistant; Dr. Irida Hasalla; Dr. Bashkim Kadriu; Dr. Elizabeth Lulaj; Dr. Zana Nikolla; and Dr. Ismet Lukolic, serving as moderator of the event.

## **Honorary Member Induction**

The Albanian American Medical Society celebrated the induction of Dr. Peter E. Pochi as an Honorary Member. Dr. Pochi, a first-generation Albanian-American, completed his undergraduate studies with honors from Harvard University in 1950 and subsequently obtained a medical degree from Boston University School of Medicine in 1955. After completion of a one-year internship at Boston City Hospital and a two-year service as a Medical Officer in the US Navy from 1956-1958, Dr. Pochi attended dermatology residency at University Hospital in Boston, MA, from 1958-1961.

Among the numerous honors and awards Dr. Pochi has received throughout his career, as well as memberships in several medical organizations, including the status of Fellow of the American Academy of Dermatology and the Massachusetts Medical Society, Dr. Pochi has also produced over 150 publications in peer-reviewed journals. Upon his retirement, Dr. Pochi also donated his entire medical library to the dermatology department of Tirana University School of Medicine.

A world-renowned leader in the field of dermatology, an educator, and a determined clinician, Dr. Pochi was once again honored through AAMS. He received his honorary member certificate on November 19, 2011.

Dr. Pochi expressed the continued need of physicians in the United States observed by the dramatic increase in the number of medical school graduates. He also stressed the importance of annual dermatologic screening especially for early detection and early treatment melanoma.

Members of AAMS shared their pride for such a talented professional to be associated with the society. The induction ceremony concluded with a question answer forum with Dr. Pochi.
